Intro: [G] [GM7] [G6] [GM7]


[G] Just a gigolo, [GM7] everywhere I go
[G6] people know the part I'm [D7] playing.
Paid for every dance [C] selling each romance
[D7] Every night some heart [G] betraying

[C6] Youth will pass away

When the [C] end comes I [Cm] know they'll say
[GM7] just a gigolo
As [C6] life goes [D7] on with-[G]-out me.

Notice that the G7 to A9 (4 chord) "run" in the "I Ain't Got Nobody" song uses the "F7 shape" that starts with 4535 then 3424 then 2313 then 1202.



NOTICE! This "run" is the same shape chord simply moved "down" (towards the head) the fretboard (until the A9 which only requires you to then move one finger)!
