[F] Probably be [G] driving kids to [C] school.

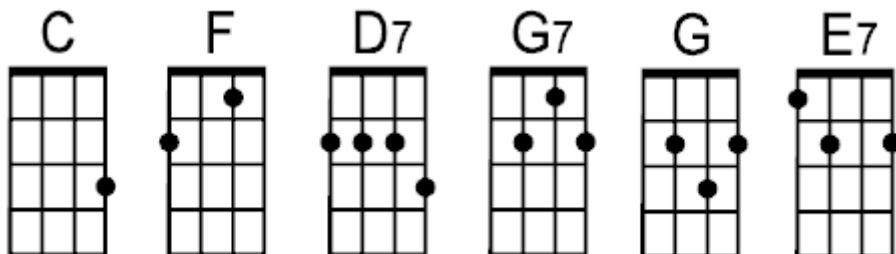
And [F] I guess I owe it [G] all to Pamela [C] Brown
